Simple Steps for **Getting Your Project Started**

Thinking about remodeling a living area, such as a kitchen or bath, can be overwhelming, especially if you think of it as one big project. Instead, approach your project in small pieces. We are here to guide you every step of the way. The first step in the process is creating a very rough drawing of your current space. Simply follow these steps:

- 1. Gather your tools—Use the guide on page 2 and grid paper on page 3, a pencil and eraser, and a measuring tape.
- 2. Measure your room. Start in one corner and measure the wall. Record all measurements in inches. Draw each wall on the grid paper and write in the inches.
- 3. Draw in doors and windows. Indicate which way they swing open. When measuring windows and doors, please include the trim as part of your measurement. For instance, a 3" trim on one side of the window, plus a 30" window, plus a 3" trim on the other side of the window, equals a 36" window. Draw in any other breaks in the walls.
- 4. After you have measured and recorded each wall and its measurement in inches on your grid, measure and roughly draw in each item against each wall on the grid. For instance, there may be an appliance or a grouping of cabinets.
- 5. Write down the ceiling height of your room.
- 6. Make a notation of all existing appliance dimensions.



Of course, you are always welcome to drop-in as well.) The drawing you've created is simply a starting point. Once you decide to select products and reach a more detailed stage in design planning, your designer will come to your home to do a professional measure. This initial rough drawing will simply help your designer get a sense of your space so the more detailed work of creating your dream room can begin!


How to Create a Rough Drawing of Your Current Space


Step 1: Measure the walls, doors, & windows.
